What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by English-speaking guides. A second language may be used, depending on the number of non-English-speaking passengers and the availability of guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked onboard, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Library.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- To provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged. Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Transfers can also be prepaid prior to your cruise.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available onboard the ship in a file at the Library and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

DIKILI - Ancient Pergamon

Pick up from the pier at Dikili and have a short drive to the ancient city of Pergamum. Originally a small settlement during the earliest Archaic period, Pergamum became famous after Philetairos, who became an eminent personality after the fall of Lysimachus. For over a century, Pergamum was considered the centre of all cultural activity during the Hellenistic period. Travellers from all over the country knew of this great city and often travelled hundreds of miles to visit the beautiful and vibrant city. Pergamum saw the rise and fall of many rulers and during the reign of Eumenes the Second, Pergamum became the richest city in the world after the spoils of war from Athens were brought to the city and used to fill the coffers of all the rich men who lived there.

Art and science flourished in equal measure and some of the country's greatest artists came from this great city.

Take a cable car to the Acropolis of Pergamum. After visiting the Acropolis, you will descend to the coach park for a short ride to Asklepion, where you will visit the remains of the oldest therapeutic centres in the world.

At the end of your visit you will be taken back to our pier in Dikili.

Please note: This tour involves prolonged walking on cobblestones and uneven surfaces with inclines and steps.

Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

The bus journey between Dikili and Pergamum takes approximately 40 minutes each way. The drive from the Acropolis car park and Asklepion takes about 15 minutes. There is a cable car service between the Acropolis coach park and the site.

LIMNOS (Myrina) – Lemnos at ease

The coach leaves the port of Myrina for a scenic drive through the countryside to the town of Moudros.

Moudros, the former capital of Lemnos, is the second largest town on the island. During the ill-fated Dardanelles campaign of the First World War, the town and its harbour were used as an Allied base. Hundreds of young men lost their lives here and are buried in the Allied Cemetery.

You have some free time to explore the seafront or just relax and soak up the atmosphere in one of the cafes.

Next stop is Kotsinas, a small fishing village on the north coast of Lemnos, which in classical times was a trading port for the nearby town of Hephaistia.

Tavernas line the seafront and on a hill above the village stands the church of Zoodochos Pigi (Life-Giving Spring), built over an underground well. Next to the church is a statue honouring the legendary heroine Maroula. In 1478 Suleiman Pasha besieged Kotsina and when Maroula saw that her father had been struck down, instead of crying and wailing, she grabbed his sword and fought on, saving the island from the Turkish invaders.

We then return to the town of Myrina for a pleasant walk along the coast to admire the neoclassical houses and the fortress.

Please note: Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

Driving between the places will not be long, 20-30 min. Walking in Kotsinas and Moudros will be at discretion of the passengers, and in town will be longer, about 1 km. The order of the visits is subject to change.

MOUNT ATHOS (morning) - Panoramic sailing along the coast

Enjoy a panoramic sailing trip off the coast of the Mount Athos peninsula, located at the easternmost tip of Chalkidiki. The peninsula stretches 50 km in length and 12 km in width and is crowned by the 2,030-metre-high peak of Mount Athos at its southernmost extremity.

Mount Athos peninsula is also known as the 'Holy Mountain' (Agion Oros), the peninsula is home to 20 Orthodox monasteries, most of which were founded between the 10th and 14th centuries. Around 2,000 monks still live in these monasteries today. Access to the peninsula is strictly limited: only men with a special visa are permitted to visit, and only a limited number are granted each day. Recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1988, Mount Athos is celebrated for its rich religious heritage, well-preserved monastic architecture, and unspoilt natural surroundings.

As you sail along the west coast of the peninsula from south to north, you can admire some of the spectacular monastery buildings, lush forests and steep cliffs leading down to the Aegean Sea from the open deck of the ship.

Starting from the picturesque village of Ouranoupoli beneath the medieval Prosforion Tower, we follow an ancient path towards the border of Mount Athos. After a pleasant walk offering views of the Aegean Sea, we arrive at the evocative ruins of Zygos Monastery. Founded in the 10th century, it was once a powerful stronghold of the Holy Mountain. Abandoned over 700 years ago, Zygos is unique in that it stands just outside the Athos frontier, making it the only monastery that women are permitted to visit. Within its sturdy walls and towers, archaeologists have unearthed chapels, living quarters and defensive gates, offering a glimpse into the monastery's spiritual and historical significance. Surrounded by nature and overlooking the sea, the site offers visitors a rare insight into the early monastic world of Mount Athos without having to cross its guarded borders.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over dirt path and gentle slopes, with some uneven ground (approx. 2 km each way). Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

Sightseeing | Panoramic

A minibus will be waiting at the harbour to take you to the northern part of the island, called Kastri, where you will visit the small church dedicated to St John the Baptist. Climb up the stone steps carved into the rock, and at the top you will be rewarded with breathtaking views of the archipelago. This humble but picturesque chapel became famous after the filming of Mamma Mia in Skopelos in 2007, when it was chosen for Sophie's wedding. On the same spot, Donna (Meryl Streep) sings ABBA's famous hit "The Winner Takes It All" to Sam (Pierce Brosnan). The tour continues to Kastani Beach, which is also featured in the film.

The scene where the cast danced on the jetty was filmed here, although the jetty was built specifically for the film and dismantled afterwards. It was here that Tanya sang "Does your Mother Know" and Sophie and Sky were filmed singing "Lay all your love on me". It is also the backdrop for Donna and the dads' farewell to Sophie and Sky, where they sing "I have a dream". You will not find Donna's bar, but there is a very nice private beach bar where you can buy a drink or go for a swim. On the way back to the harbour there is a short stop at Agnonda's beach to get a glimpse of Cape Amarandos. This rocky peninsula with three isolated pine trees was also featured in the film.

Back in Skopelos, you will have some free time to explore on your own or do some shopping before rejoining the ship.

Please note: This walk involves extensive walking over cobbles and uneven surfaces with many steps and inclines. There are 200 stone steps up to St John's chapel.

The journey from the harbour to the chapel takes approximately 60 minutes (it may take longer in high season).

Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

POROS - Epidaurus theatre and museum

Transfer by ship's tender boat to the port of Galatas on the Argolid peninsula, where you will meet your local guide and board your coach for the short journey to Epidaurus.

Epidaurus was the site of a shrine dedicated to Aesculapius, the Greek god of medicine. Patients flocked to the sanctuary seeking a cure for their ailments, and Aesculapius would either perform a cure while they slept or appear in a dream to the priests, who would then treat the patient according to his instructions. As well as praying to be cured, patients could also enjoy thermal baths and hydrotherapy, as well as a "show"! As soon as you arrive at the site, you will walk through a beautiful grove to discover the famous theatre, one of the best-preserved monuments of the ancient world.

The theatre holds 14,000 spectators and is famous for its acoustics. It is still in use today and modern visitors enjoy musical productions and performances of Greek drama. You will have some time to wander around so you can test the wonderful acoustics for yourself. The nearby museum houses fragments of the Asklepon sanctuary.

Please note: This involves extensive walking (approximately 1.5 hours) on uneven ground, but no uphill walking. Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

The tour starts from the village of Galatas (on the mainland, not on the island of Poros). The ship's tender will take you directly to Galats, where your guide and bus will be waiting for you. At the end of the tour the tender will take you directly to the ship. The journey to Epidaurus takes approximately 45 minutes each way.

PIRAEUS (Port of ATHENS)

Star Clippers offers the following transfer services (optional, on request):

- Shared Transfer to Athens airport.

Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their own pick up time.

There is a fixed departure from the port at approximately 08:45.

This transfer is suitable for guests whose flight departs after 12:00.

- Private transfers to Athens airport or to hotels in Athens.

Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.

Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).

- Private transfers from hotels to the airport.

Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).

This service can only be pre-booked.

Transfers and excursions ending at the airport can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made onboard during the cruise are always subject to availability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you book well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

For information and reservations please contact our reservations department or your travel agent.

The ship will be alongside at one of the three cruise terminals at Piraeus port, located at approximately 10 km from Athens city center and 42 km from Athens airport. All guests must leave the ship by 10:00am.



EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy:** excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate:** a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking - sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous:** active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous:** a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ **Culture & History:** it explores places of historical significance, visits ancient ruins or historic buildings, gives a deeper understanding of the region's heritage.
- ✓ **Sightseeing:** it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ **Food & Wine:** it explores the culinary traditions of a region, from local markets and vineyards to cooking classes or wine tastings.
- ✓ **Panoramic:** it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and - generally - limited walking between stops.
- ✓ **Active & Adventure:** Hiking, kayaking, cycling, ATV, 4x4 off-road.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap and sun lotion.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash in local currency.
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
