

What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by local English-speaking guides or driver-guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.
- Transportation: roads in the islands can be winding and bumpy. Vehicles used (coasters, minibuses, minivans) have generally small seats and limited space and legroom.
- Guests will be required to sign a liability waiver to participate in some activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked onboard, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Library.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- To provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged. Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Transfers and tours ending at the airport can also be prepaid prior to your cruise.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available onboard the ship in a file at the Library and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

TOBAGO (Charlotteville) – Angel Reef snokelling adventure

Snorkeling

Begin your excursion with a short tender ride from the ship to the quaint pier in Charlotteville, where you'll board a minibus for a scenic 30-minute drive through Tobago's lush, mountainous interior en route to Speyside, on the northeast coast. Upon arrival at the Speyside beach jetty, you'll board a glass-bottom boat and cruise along the island's stunning emerald coastline before heading out to Angel Reef - a world-renowned snorkeling and diving destination. Known for its crystal-clear waters with visibility up to 100 feet, Angel Reef offers a spectacular underwater experience. As you glide across the water, your guide will highlight local points of interest and share insights into the reef's vibrant marine ecosystem. Drift over ancient coral formations, giant sea sponges, and schools of colorful reef fish thriving in their natural habitat. Once anchored, you'll have the opportunity to snorkel, swim, or simply relax on board and take in the beauty of this Caribbean paradise.

After your aquatic adventure, return to Speyside beach to rejoin your minibus for the return drive to Charlotteville and tender back to your ship.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or for pregnant women.
- The itinerary and sequence of activities may vary depending on sea/weather conditions, at the captain's discretion.
- Snorkeling is only recommended for experienced swimmers.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided please bring your own gear from the ship.
- Travel times: approx. 30 min by minibus from Charlotteville to Speyside; 25 min by boat to Angel Reef. Roads in Tobago are winding and may be bumpy in places.

TOBAGO (Charlotteville) - Argyle Waterfalls trail



Outdoor | Active & Adventure

Embark on a scenic half-day adventure through Tobago's lush rainforest, with a visit to the breathtaking Argyle Waterfalls. Your journey begins with a 45-minute drive along the island's picturesque Windward Coast to the town of Roxborough, where you'll enter the Tobago Main Ridge Forest Reserve - the oldest legally protected forest reserve in the Western Hemisphere and a UNESCO-recognized site of ecological significance.

Upon arrival, join a naturalist guide for a moderate 30-minute hike (each way) along a forest trail rich in tropical flora and fauna. Your destination is the stunning Argyle Waterfall, a serene three-tiered cascade set in the heart of the reserve. Enjoy approximately one hour at the falls, where you may swim in the natural pool, explore the area, or simply relax and take in the peaceful surroundings. After your rainforest and waterfall experience, return to the visitor center and board your minibus for the scenic drive back to Charlotteville.

- Wear your swimsuit under your clothes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, a towel from the ship and water.
- The trail and area around the waterfall are uneven and can be slippery, especially after rain. Sturdy footwear is recommended.
- Walking time is approx. 1 hour (30 min each way), on uneven and dirty ground with inclines.
- Guests will spend approximately 1 hour at the waterfall. Swimming is optional. The water may not always be crystal clear particularly after rain.
- The minibus journey between the port and the visitor center takes approx. 45 min. Roads in Tobago are winding and may be bumpy in places.



TOBAGO (Castara bay) – Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

Castara bay is flanked by lush rainforests, offering passengers a serene retreat amidst nature's splendor. With its pristine sandy shores and calm turquoise waters, it is an ideal spot for swimming, snorkeling, and simply unwinding while taking in the breathtaking views. The village of Castara nearby provides a glimpse into local life, with charming guesthouses, vibrant fishing traditions, and delicious Creole cuisine.

TOBAGO CAYS – Discover the Southern Grenadines by sailing catamaran



Boating | Snorkeling

Embark on an unforgettable cruise through the crystal-clear waters and white-sand beaches of the Tobago Cays Marine National Park. Your first stop is Horseshoe Reef, a vibrant underwater site ideal for snorkeling and swimming among colorful marine life.

Next, enjoy a refreshing rum punch and a swim at the stunning Salt Whistle Bay on Mayreau Island—celebrated as one of the top 10 beaches in the Caribbean. Relax on the beach, swim in turquoise waters, or snorkel at your leisure during this truly memorable experience.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Minimum age is 12 years, and children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided please bring your gear from the ship
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides.
- The boats for this excursion depart from St Vincent, and the crossing to the Tobago Cays depends on the sea conditions. sea. The excursion may have to be cancelled if the sea is rough.

CARRIACOU (Paradise beach) – Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

Carriacou is located north of the island of Grenada and south of the Grenadines and is part of the nation of Grenada. Often referred to as the 'Isle of Reefs', it is known for its clear turquoise waters, uncrowded white sand beaches such as Paradise Beach and Anse La Roche, and vibrant coral reefs that attract divers from around the world.

The island's waters are teeming with marine life, including sea turtles, stingrays and colorful fish, with excellent visibility all year round.

CANOUAN (Charlestown bay) – Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

Canouan is a peaceful little gem in the Grenadines, just 5.6km long, offering a perfect blend of unspoilt natural beauty and subtle luxury. Charlestown Bay, with its fishing boats and backdrop of lush green hills, creates a tranquil and welcoming atmosphere. Visitors can relax on unspoilt beaches such as Grand Bay and South Glossy Bay, both protected by a barrier reef, making them ideal for swimming and snorkeling.

For the more adventurous, a hike to Mount Royal, the island's highest point, offers breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding Grenadines.



BEQUIA - Bequia's heritage tour by offroad vehicle

Discover the rich maritime heritage of Bequia, an island once renowned for whaling and boat building, where traditional skills and a seafaring lifestyle still thrive. Nestled in the sheltered Admiralty Bay, Bequia's peaceful harbor has long attracted visiting yachtsmen eager to experience its charm.

Join us for a scenic 2-hour off-road tour that offers a genuine glimpse into island life. Travel along the main road northwest of Port Elizabeth to the village of Hamilton, home to the 18th-century Hamilton Battery. Here, French cannons—carefully restored and remounted—tell the story of the island's colonial past. From the battery, enjoy spectacular views over Port Elizabeth.

Continue northeast to Spring Bay, a shallow cove at the foot of a majestic coconut grove with trees reaching over 100 feet tall. This fertile valley was once a thriving sugar plantation, and the nearby ruins of the Spring Sugar Factory now house the charming Firefly Hotel on an historic estate.

Your journey continues through Industry, where you'll take in the island's beautiful landscape before heading to the famous lookout at Mount Pleasant. Return to the harbor and soak in the tranquility of this stunning island before boarding your vessel.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or those with back, neck, or other conditions sensitive to bumpy roads.
- Vehicles are open off-road jeeps/pickups with professional driver-guides, each accommodating up to 8 passengers. Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.

BEQUIA - Snorkeling tour in Bequia

Discover the underwater wonders of Bequia, a gem of the Grenadines. Surrounded by crystal-clear Caribbean waters, Bequia offers exceptional snorkeling with vibrant coral reefs, colorful marine life, and intriguing shipwrecks teeming with aquatic creatures.

This snorkeling adventure takes you along Bequia's stunning coastline, with breathtaking views of Moon Hole. We'll stop along the way for snorkeling at several prime locations, including Semplers Cay, Middle Cay, and the pristine waters of Petit Nevis. At Petit Nevis, immerse yourself in the vivid underwater world - swim among tropical fish, explore the reefs, and experience the beauty of Bequia's marine ecosystem up close.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Minimum age is 12 years, and children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided please bring your gear from the ship
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides



MARTINIQUE (Saint-Pierre) - Habitation Céron and Depaz rum distillery

Sightseeing | Tasting

Embark on a scenic drive along Martinique's picturesque northern coastline to the peaceful village of Le Prêcheur, located at the island's northern tip. Enjoy stunning views of the sea and lush, tropical landscapes along the way. Your first stop is Habitation Céron, a meticulously restored 17th-century sugar estate nestled on the northwestern slopes of Mount Pelée, a UNESCO-recognized biodiversity hotspot. This historic site offers a unique blend of heritage and nature. Wander through its beautifully landscaped tropical gardens, and encounter the majestic Zamana Tree—a 19th-century giant that dominates the 5,000m² park with its awe-inspiring presence. The peaceful surroundings provide a moment to reflect on Martinique's rich history and vibrant ecosystem.

Continue to the Depaz Distillery, where you'll delve into the traditional methods of crafting rhum agricole, Martinique's signature spirit. Unlike most rums made from molasses, rhum agricole is distilled from fresh sugar cane juice and protected under the Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC), a French certification of authenticity and quality. Learn about the distilling process and the importance of Martinique's unique terroir—its volcanic soil, tropical climate, and ancestral techniques. You'll also have the opportunity to sample a selection of the distillery's acclaimed rums while enjoying the tranquil gardens that surround the estate. After this enriching experience, return to your ship with a deeper understanding of Martinique's cultural heritage, natural beauty, and exceptional rum-making traditions.

Please note:

- This tour involves approximately 2 hours of walking over uneven surfaces, including inclines and steps.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- Estimated driving times: 35 min from Saint-Pierre to Habitation Céron; 35 min from Habitation Céron to Depaz Distillery; 15 min from the distillery back to Saint-Pierre. The order of site visits may vary.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière



Sightseeing

Drive through the historic town of Soufrière, passing the town square and Cathedral, and arrive at Sulphur Springs Park—home to the Caribbean's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly into the remnants of a volcanic crater, a dramatic moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and clouds of steam rise with the distinctive scent of sulphur.

Continue your journey to the Soufrière Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, this is one of the island's oldest estates. Stroll through the lush botanical garden, admire tropical plants lining the path, and enjoy the beauty of the cascading waterfall before reboarding the bus.

After a short drive, arrive at a charming hillside restaurant offering panoramic views of the iconic Pitons—St. Lucia's famous twin peaks rising dramatically from Soufrière Bay.

Have your camera ready for a perfect photo opportunity while enjoying a complimentary glass of local rum punch or fruit juice on the verandah. The tour concludes with a short drive back down to the port.

Please note:

- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, and US \$ if they wish to purchase souvenirs.



SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Soufrière and Tet Paul nature trail hike

Set off from the Soufrière dock for a short drive through town before heading "back to nature" on a guided hike along the Tet Paul Nature Trail, led by a knowledgeable local nature guide. As you walk through this spectacular landscape, your guide will share insights into the island's flora and fauna, folk remedies, local customs, and traditions, making this more than just a nature walk—it's an interactive cultural experience.

There will be plenty of breathtaking photo opportunities, including panoramic views of the majestic Pitons, the faraway island of St. Vincent, the lush southern region of St. Lucia, and Jalousie Bay. Be sure to bring your camera to capture the unforgettable scenery.

At the end of the trail, you'll have time to relax and enjoy local refreshments and snacks before returning to Soufrière.

Please note:

- This tour is considered strenuous and is suitable only for guests in very good physical condition.
- The nature trail involves hiking through rainforest on uneven terrain, dirt tracks, narrow paths, and moderate to steep inclines. The trail may be muddy if it has rained recently. The hike takes approximately 45 minutes, depending on the group's pace. There is limited shade along the trail.
- Wear light, comfortable clothing and appropriate hiking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water. A refreshment will be served after the hike.
- The drive between Soufrière and the trailhead takes approximately 15 minutes on a winding, bumpy road.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) – Snorkelling at the Marine Reserve



Boating | Snorkeling

Soufrière is home to some of the Caribbean's most vibrant and well-preserved coral reefs, offering a rich underwater world teeming with marine life. Depart from the Soufrière dock aboard a motorized catamaran or 38-foot Bertram for an unforgettable snorkeling experience at one of the island's designated Marine Reserves.

Once anchored, you will enter the water directly from the boat, either by jumping in or using a water ladder. Spend time snorkeling in crystal-clear waters, exploring thriving coral reefs and observing a colorful array of tropical reef fish and other marine life in their natural habitat. After your underwater adventure, reboard the boat for a leisurely return cruise to the Soufrière pier.

- Participants must be comfortable entering deep water from the boat or via a water ladder and able to snorkel without assistance. Min age: 13 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight: 250 lbs (113 kg).
- Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, a towel and water.
- Snorkeling equipment is provided (mask, snorkel, fins, and snorkel vests).
- The boat transfer to the Marine Reserve takes approx. 20 minutes (each way).



BARBADOS (Bridgetown) - Catamaran sail and swim with the turtles

After a 30-minute transfer from the port of Bridgetown, board a catamaran for a relaxing sail along the picturesque west coast of Barbados. Enjoy a scenic cruise on crystal-clear waters, with the opportunity to snorkel among reef fish, explore a shallow shipwreck, and swim alongside sea turtles.

As you unwind on deck, take in the warm Caribbean breeze and sip a refreshing drink from the open bar, offering cocktails, rum punch, and soft drinks. With a friendly crew and laid-back atmosphere, this catamaran tour is a perfect way to experience the natural beauty of Barbados from the sea.

Please note:

- There is a 30 minutes transfer by minibus between the port and the catamaran dock.
- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Unlimited beverages are provided throughout, including rum punch (after the snorkeling), juices and mineral water.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, aqua shoes and a hat. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins).
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather and sea conditions. The catamaran can use engin or sail, depending on sea and wind conditions.

BARBADOS (Bridgetown) - Explore Barbados' Countryside by 4x4



Active & Adventure

Enjoy a fun-filled exploration of Barbados in specially designed 4x4 vehicles from start to finish! Your adventure begins at the port, where our driver-guides lead you into the island's lush interior - an area largely inaccessible by other means of transport. The convoy winds its way through the countryside, passing historic sugar estates and timeless Great Houses. With a bit of luck, you may even spot the island's playful Barbadian Green Monkeys.

One of the highlights is a stop at a breathtaking cliff, 1,000 feet above sea level, offering spectacular views of the rugged eastern coastline. Descend to the unspoiled East Coast road - locally known as Cattlewash - where the spray of the Atlantic Ocean and dramatic scenery provide perfect photo opportunities.

Refreshments are served on board as you relax and mingle. The journey continues through the quaint villages of the Scotland District before transitioning to the island's famed Platinum Coast, known for its luxury resorts and five-star properties - a striking contrast that unfolds before your eyes in just minutes.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or those with back, neck, or other conditions sensitive to bumpy roads. Participants are required to sign a waiver.
- Vehicles are open off-road jeeps / pickups with professional driver-guides.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.



MAYREAU (Saline bay) – Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

Mayreau is the smallest inhabited island in the Grenadines, covering just 0.46 square miles and home to around 270 people. Accessible only by boat, it offers a tranquil retreat with limited infrastructure.

Saline Bay has a long, gently curving beach with calm waters backed by lush greenery and easy access to the small village. The island is part of the Tobago Cays Marine Park, renowned for its coral reefs and clear waters, ideal for snorkeling. The small village next to the beach offers several restaurants and bars and a Catholic church perched on a hill with panoramic views of the Grenadines. Mayreau's natural beauty and relaxed atmosphere make it a memorable stop for cruisers seeking authentic Caribbean charm.

GRENADA (St George's) - Farewell to Grenada (ending at GND airport)



Sightseeing | Airport transfer

This excursion ends at Grenada Intl. Airport (GND) at approx. 13:15 and is suitable for guests with flight after 15:30.

Embark on a captivating journey through the heart of the "Spice Isle" with our Farewell to Grenada tour -a thoughtfully curated half-day experience that offers a blend of history, nature and taste.

Your experience begins with a scenic drive to Fort Frederick, an 18th-century hilltop fort that commands sweeping views of the capital and the island's lush interior. As you explore the well-preserved ramparts, you'll gain insight into Grenada's colonial history and the strategic importance of this remarkable site.

The journey continues into the island's rainforest to visit the serene Annandale Falls. Here, surrounded by tropical foliage and the soothing sound of cascading water, you'll enjoy a peaceful walk through nature.

Next, you will delve into one of Grenada's proudest traditions with a behind-the-scenes visit to the Tri-Island Chocolate Factory. Discover how fine organic cocoa is transformed from bean to bar, and sample a variety of rich, handcrafted chocolates that showcase the island's artisanal excellence.

The tour then makes its way to a restaurant, where you will enjoy a lunch of locally inspired cuisine.

Your tour concludes with a comfortable transfer to "Maurice Bishop" international airport, located on the southwest end of the island, arriving in time for your onward flight.

Please note:

- Luggage will be transported on a separate truck and delivered to the airport. Guests must retrieve their it upon arrival at the airport before check-in.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

GRENADA (Saint George's)

Star Clippers also offers the following transfer services (optional, at an additional cost):

- Private transfers to "Maurice Bishop" Grenada Intl. Airport or to hotels.

Private transfers can be arranged from the pier to any hotel on south the island. Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.

- Private transfers from hotels to the airport.

Private transfers can be arranged from any hotel on south the island.

This service can only be pre-booked prior to your cruise and cannot be booked onboard.

Transfers and excursions ending at the airport can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made onboard during the cruise are always subject to avaialability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you book well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

For information and reservations please contact our reservations department or your travel agent.

The ship will be alongside at Saint George's Harbour (commercial port).

GND airport is located 10 km from the cruise port (approx. 30 minutes drive).

All guests are requested to leave the ship by 10:00am. There is no left-luggage service at the cruise terminal.



EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy**: excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate**: a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous**: active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous**: a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport)**: Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ Sightseeing: it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ Panoramic: it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and generally limited walking between stops.
- ✓ Active & Adventure: Hiking, kayaking, Zip line, 4x4 off-road.
- ✓ Outdoors: Activities like hiking that let you explore the natural beauty of the region.
- ✓ Wildlife: Wildlife: Get up close to the region's fauna and learn about them in their natural habitats.
- ✓ Snorkeling. Guests participating in the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers. Itinerary and snorkel sites are subject to change due to sea and weather conditions. Check in the tour description to see if the snorkeling equipment is provided or if you must bring the equipment from the ship.
- ✓ Boating: Experience the destination from the water, whether it's sailing, cruising, or other maritime activities.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap, sun lotion, insect repellent.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash (US \$ is widely accepted, bring Euros for French islands).
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
