What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by local English-speaking guides or driver-guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.
- Transportation: roads in the islands can be winding and bumpy. Vehicles used (coasters, minibuses, minivans) have generally small seats and limited space and legroom.
- Guests will be required to sign a liability waiver to participate in some activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked onboard, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Excursion Desk. The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- To provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged. Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Transfers and tours ending at the airport can also be prepaid prior to your cruise.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available onboard the ship in a file at the Excursion Desk and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

GRENADINES - CAPTAIN'S BEST - Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

The Grenadines are a breathtaking chain of thirty islands and tiny islets, celebrated for their unspoiled beauty and serene charm. On this voyage, we'll stop at one of these secluded gems for a carefree beach day. Picture soft sands, turquoise waters, and the kind of tranquility only the Grenadines can offer. Whether you're lounging under the sun or swimming in crystal-clear seas, this stop promises pure Caribbean bliss. You won't be disappointed.

GRENADA (Saint George's) - Chocolate and falls



Panoramic | Sightseeing

This aromatic island tour offers a fascinating look into the world of Grenada's celebrated organic chocolate. Your journey begins with a visit to the Diamond Chocolate Factory, located in the village of Victoria on the island's west coast. Housed in a converted 18th-century rum distillery originally built by French monks, the factory is home to the renowned "Jouvay" chocolate - named one of the world's top ten chocolates by National Geographic.

Although the visit does not include entry into the production area of the factory, you will gain insight into the full process of chocolate-making - from the harvesting of cocoa beans to seeing them sun-dried on traditional trays.

A walk through the cocoa garden offers the chance to observe cocoa trees alongside other fragrant plants like nutmeg, cloves, chili, tropical flowers, and fruit trees. The visit concludes with a delicious chocolate tasting session. Afterward, continue to Concord Falls, set amidst the lush tropical forest where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the hillsides. Upon arrival, relax with a complimentary drink and, if conditions permit, take a refreshing swim in the natural waterfall pool. Following your visit, enjoy the scenic 45-minute drive back to the cruise terminal.

Please note:

- The order of visits may be reversed, with the waterfall visit first and the chocolate factory second.
- Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, a towel from the ship and water.
- Guests will have the opportunity to swim at the waterfall. The water may not always be crystal clear particularly after rain. The terrain around the waterfall is uneven and can be slippery.
- This tour involves a long total travel time by minibus: 1h15min from St George's to the Chocolate factory, 45 min from the Chocolate factory to the waterfall, 45min from the waterfall to St George's. Roads may be bumpy in places.

GRENADA (Saint George's) - Catamaran and snorkeling adventure



Boating | Snorkeling

Sail from St. George's Harbor aboard a comfortable catamaran and cruise along Grenada's scenic west coast to your first stop: Molinere Bay. Here, you'll enjoy a snorkeling experience at the renowned Underwater Sculpture Park, located within Grenada's Marine Protected Area. The statues are thoughtfully placed to complement the reef's natural contours and promote marine life. Following your underwater exploration, the catamaran continues to Mango Bay Beach for a second stop. This is a wet landing, requiring guests to step into ankle-deep water to reach the shore. After time to relax or swim, enjoy a leisurely one-hour sail back to the cruise terminal.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers. Guests must be able to walk through shallow water at Mango Bay. Half of the boat has shade.
- Unlimited beverages are provided throughout, including rum punch (after the snorkeling), juices and mineral water.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, aqua shoes and a hat. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins).
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides.



GRENADA (Saint George's) - Trek to Bamboo Falls - A Rainforest Experience

This excursion is perfect for nature enthusiasts, offering a scenic and enriching journey that begins in St. George's and winds up through steep, twisting roads to the heart of Grenada's lush interior. The destination: Grand Etang Forest Reserve, a vibrant sanctuary nestled 1,900 feet above sea level in the island's Central Mountain Range.

Surrounded by dense rainforest, towering mahogany trees, tropical ferns, and colorful blooms, Grand Etang is home to a wide variety of birdlife and local wildlife. From here, an invigorating trek begins—leading you through a private plantation rich with nutmeg, cocoa, bananas, and other tropical plants, before reaching the stunning Bamboo Falls. The hike to the falls takes approximately 30 minutes and can be muddy or slippery, particularly after rainfall, so sturdy, closed-toe footwear with good grip is essential. You'll also cross a shallow river, with water up to knee height, so expect your shoes to get wet.

Bamboo Falls is considered one of Grenada's most beautiful and iconic waterfalls—well worth the effort of the hike. If you'd like to take a dip, wear your swimsuit under comfortable hiking clothes and consider bringing aqua shoes. After the trek, enjoy a refreshing glass of fresh, organic local orange juice upon your return to the Cruise Terminal.

Please note:

- This is a strenuous tour and is suitable only for guests in very good physical condition. The route includes muddy trails, steep inclines, and a river crossing. Be prepared to get your feet and shoes wet while crossing the stream.
- Wear light clothing and comfortable hiking shoes (closed-toe with good grip), and bring a hat, sunscreen and plenty of water. Guests who wish to swim at the waterfall should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring aqua shoes.
- The drive from the port to the trailhead takes approx. 45 minutes on a winding road that may be bumpy in places.

TOBAGO CAYS – Discover the Southern Grenadines by sailing catamaran



Boating | Snorkeling

Embark on an unforgettable cruise through the crystal-clear waters and white-sand beaches of the Tobago Cays Marine National Park. Your first stop is Horseshoe Reef, a vibrant underwater site ideal for snorkeling and swimming among colorful marine life.

Next, enjoy a refreshing rum punch and a swim at the stunning Salt Whistle Bay on Mayreau Island—celebrated as one of the top 10 beaches in the Caribbean. Relax on the beach, swim in turquoise waters, or snorkel at your leisure during this truly memorable experience.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Minimum age is 12 years, and children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided please bring your gear from the ship
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides.
- The boats for this excursion depart from St Vincent, and the crossing to the Tobago Cays depends on the sea conditions. sea. The excursion may have to be cancelled if the sea is rough.



SAINT VINCENT (Kingstown) - Garden of Eden



Panoramic | Sightseeing

Begin your journey with a guided drive through Kingstown, the capital of St. Vincent, where colonial charm meets modern Caribbean life. Admire the architectural blend before heading inland to the lush Mesopotamia Valley, also known as the Marriagua Valley—a fertile area often called the "island's breadbasket."

Here, the rich volcanic soil sustains thriving plantations of bananas, cocoa, nutmeg, breadfruit, coconuts, and various root crops, forming a lush, panoramic landscape.

Your main stop is at the Montreal Gardens, one of the island's premier floral attractions. Nestled in the rainforest-covered hills, the gardens feature a wide array of tropical plants and flowers, including bougainvillea, frangipani, hibiscus, and delicate anthurium lilies. Enjoy the peaceful atmosphere and take in the stunning views over local farmland and the distant sea.

After your garden visit (approx. 1.5 hours), continue your scenic drive through rural villages, where you'll catch a glimpse of everyday life—farmers working the hillsides with traditional tools like machetes. The tour concludes with a drive along the picturesque Atlantic coast, ending with a breathtaking hilltop view of Kingstown and your cruise ship below

Please note:

- This tour includes moderate walking on uneven terrain, inclines, and approximately 100 steps (not all at once). Guests will spend about 1 hour and 30 minutes at the Montreal Gardens.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring sunscreen, insect repellent, a hat, and water. Total driving time is approximately 2 hours, along winding and occasionally bumpy roads.

SAINT VINCENT (Kingstown) – Reef life tour

Departing from the cruise terminal, set off on a scenic coastal cruise along the leeward coast of St. Vincent. Pass Fort Charlotte, colorful fishing villages, and secluded tropical bays as you make your way to Mount Wynne Bay, home to the island's oldest coconut plantation.

At Mt. Wynne Beach, enjoy snorkeling and/or beachcombing in one of the island's most beautiful natural settings. The therapeutic black sand creates a striking contrast against the crystal-clear water, and the vibrant marine life—including large sea fans and a wide variety of tropical fish—offers a rewarding snorkeling experience. St. Vincent is known for having some of the richest and most diverse coral reefs in the Eastern Caribbean. Relax on the beach, swim at your leisure, and enjoy light refreshments as you soak up the sun and natural beauty of this serene bay.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with back or neck problems, limited mobility, or for pregnant women.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sun protection, sunglasses, a towel from the ship, and a change of dry clothes. Snorkeling equipment is not provided please bring your gear from the ship.



SAINT VINCENT (Kingstown) - Offroad adventure and beach stop



Sightseeing | Active & Adventure

Discover the history, natural beauty, and everyday life of St. Vincent on this off-road adventure in a convoy of openair jeeps or pickups, driven by professional guides.

Your journey begins at the cruise port, heading through Kingstown, the island's capital, where you'll pass cobblestone streets, 19th-century churches, and the bustling vegetable market. From there, continue into the countryside, making scenic stops that offer breathtaking views of Kingstown, the Grenadines, and the lush Mesopotamia Valley, with its patchwork of nutmeg, cassava, and cocoa farms, fruit trees, and banana plantations.

As you wind through deep gorges and rural paths, you'll pass farmers with machetes, donkey riders, and colorfully dressed women carrying baskets on their heads—offering an authentic glimpse into Vincentian life.

The route then leads you along the rugged Atlantic coastline, past Stubbs and Diamond, before arriving at Brighton Beach. Here, enjoy a refreshing swim and cold drinks on the black-sand beach.

Your return takes you through Calliaqua, the former capital, with a view of Fort Duvernette and Young Island Resort. You'll pass the scenic Villa and Indian Bay beaches and conclude with a spectacular hilltop view of Kingstown and the majestic mountains beyond.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or anyone with back, neck, or other conditions affected by bumpy rides. Minimum age to participate is 14 years.
- Vehicles are open off-road jeeps/pickups and accommodate 8 passengers each.
- Wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and comfortable shoes, and bring sunscreen, a hat, towel, and water.

BEQUIA - Bequia's heritage tour by offroad vehicle



Sightseeing | Active & Adventure

Discover the rich maritime heritage of Bequia, an island once renowned for whaling and boat building, where traditional skills and a seafaring lifestyle still thrive. Nestled in the sheltered Admiralty Bay, Bequia's peaceful harbor has long attracted visiting yachtsmen eager to experience its charm.

Join us for a scenic 2-hour off-road tour that offers a genuine glimpse into island life. Travel along the main road northwest of Port Elizabeth to the village of Hamilton, home to the 18th-century Hamilton Battery. Here, French cannons—carefully restored and remounted—tell the story of the island's colonial past. From the battery, enjoy spectacular views over Port Elizabeth.

Continue northeast to Spring Bay, a shallow cove at the foot of a majestic coconut grove with trees reaching over 100 feet tall. This fertile valley was once a thriving sugar plantation, and the nearby ruins of the Spring Sugar Factory now house the charming Firefly Hotel on an historic estate.

Your journey continues through Industry, where you'll take in the island's beautiful landscape before heading to the famous lookout at Mount Pleasant. Return to the harbor and soak in the tranquility of this stunning island before boarding your vessel.

- This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or those with back, neck, or other conditions sensitive to bumpy roads.
- Vehicles are open off-road jeeps/pickups with professional driver-guides, each accommodating up to 8 passengers. Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.



BEQUIA - Snorkeling tour in Bequia

Discover the underwater wonders of Bequia, a gem of the Grenadines. Surrounded by crystal-clear Caribbean waters, Bequia offers exceptional snorkeling with vibrant coral reefs, colorful marine life, and intriguing shipwrecks teeming with aquatic creatures.

This snorkeling adventure takes you along Bequia's stunning coastline, with breathtaking views of Moon Hole. We'll stop along the way for snorkeling at several prime locations, including Semplers Cay, Middle Cay, and the pristine waters of Petit Nevis. At Petit Nevis, immerse yourself in the vivid underwater world - swim among tropical fish, explore the reefs, and experience the beauty of Bequia's marine ecosystem up close.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- Minimum age is 12 years, and children must be accompanied by an adult.
- Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided – please bring your gear from the ship
- The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides

MARTINIQUE (Fort-de-France) – Balata Gardens and Habitation Clément distillery



Sightseeing | Tasting

This tours leaves from Fort-de-France and ends at Grande Anse d'Arlet (beach stop in the afternoon).

Leaving Fort-de-France, you'll travel along the historic Trace Road, originally created by Jesuits in the 18th century. More a natural track than a paved road, it winds through towering bamboo groves, giant arborescent ferns, and lianas, immersing you in Martinique's lush tropical landscape.

Your first stop is the Botanical Garden of Balata, a remarkable garden brought to life by Mr. Jean Philippe Thoze after 20 years of careful cultivation and collecting. Stroll beneath the canopy of trees and discover an enchanting array of tropical plants and flowers, thoughtfully arranged to delight the senses. The reception is housed in a lovingly restored authentic Creole house, adding to the garden's charm.

Next, you'll take a scenic drive across the island to the historic Habitation Clément plantation, a true architectural and industrial heritage site. Known as one of Martinique's premier rum producers, Habitation Clément also boasts a "remarkable garden" and a beautifully preserved Creole manor house. Explore the botanical garden with its rare collection of over 300 tropical plants, visit the rum cellars that store more than two million liters of rum, and learn about the rum-making process—ending with a tasting session.

Surrounding the manor house, the old garden features traditional trees that create a serene natural setting. The Creole manor, perched at the highest point of the estate, is exquisitely preserved and furnished with antique pieces. After the visit, you'll continue to Grande Anse d'Arlet, where your ship awaits.

- The tour involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces, with inclines and steps to negotiate.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water.
- Travel time by bus is approximately 30 minutes from Fort-de-France to Balata Gardens, 1 hour from Balata Gardens to Habitation Clément, and 1 hour from Habitation Clément to Grande Anse (beach). Roads in Martinique are winding and may be challenging for guests prone to motion sickness.



MARTINIQUE (Fort-de-France) - Balata Gardens



Sightseeing

Leaving Fort-de-France, you'll travel along the historic Trace Road, originally created by Jesuits in the 18th century. More a natural track than a paved road, it winds through towering bamboo groves, giant arborescent ferns, and lianas, immersing you in Martinique's lush tropical landscape.

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Before returning to the port, a brief photo stop is made at the nearby Balata Church, a miniature replica of the Sacred Heart Basilica of Montmartre in Paris, offering panoramic views over Fort-de-France and the bay.

Please note:

- The tour involves extensive walking (appprox. 1 hour) over uneven surfaces, with inclines and steps to negotiate.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water.
- The journey between the port and Balata Gardens takes approximately 30 minutes.

SAINT LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Panoramic Caribbean coast and Soufrière



Sightseeing

This tours leaves from Marigot bay and ends in Soufrière bay.

eparting from the picturesque Marigot Bay, you'll travel along the island's western coast, winding past the charming fishing villages of Anse la Raye and Canaries on your way south.

Your first stop is the inviting Villa des Pitons (or similar), a hillside hotel offering a delicious Creole buffet lunch with spectacular views over St. Lucia's lush rainforest. From here, the majestic Pitons - two towering volcanic peaks that symbolize the island - dominate the landscape and inspire awe.

Next, visit the historic Soufrière Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths, established in 1745 and one of the island's oldest estates. On a guided walk through the gardens, you'll see vibrant tropical plants and cascading waterfalls tumbling over mineral-streaked rocks and surrounded by thick jungle ferns.

The water flows through underground channels to a series of mineral baths at varying temperatures, prized for their therapeutic qualities.

Continuing your journey through the verdant rainforest, you'll reach La Soufrière, the world's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly to the crater's edge, where a stark moonscape of barren earth and gravel surrounds bubbling mud pools releasing steam and the unmistakable scent of sulphur. You'll have the chance to take a warm dip in the sulphur pool beneath the bridge - an unforgettable experience.

- Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. Water shoes and swimming goggles are also recommended is you wish to swim at the sulfur pool (the sulfur water may damage jewelry and swimsuits and can irritate the eyes).
- *: A buffet lunch is included, but beverages are not. Bring some US dollars to purchase drinks.
- The drive from Marigot to Soufrière takes approximately 1 hour 45 minutes, on winding roads that may may be challenging for guests prone to motion sickness.



SAINT LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Offroad adventure in St Lucia

Sightseeing | Active & Adventure

Experience fun, history, and stunning scenery on this offroad adventure that offers a unique way to see the island! Hop into your 4x4 vehicle and begin your journey through lush valleys where banana plants sway in the breeze. Enjoy a bit of off-roading as you drive through local communities, with stops along the way to sample refreshing coconut water and other seasonal fruits.

Your forest adventure starts with a short hike along a river to a charming local waterfall, where water cascades over rocks surrounded by vibrant greenery. Take a refreshing dip in the river before returning to the jeep for a drive to the quaint fishing village of Anse la Raye. Stroll along the waterfront, interact with friendly villagers, and if lucky, watch fishermen bring in their daily catch. Visit the historic Roman Catholic village church, one of the island's oldest. On your way back, drive along a scenic coastal road with elevated views of the sea - perfect for photo stops.

The final stop is at the Marigot Bay viewpoint, where you will take in the beautiful view of this picturesque and you can purchase some of the island's most delicious local sauces before heading back to your ship with wonderful memories of the day.

Please note:

- This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or those with back, neck, or other conditions sensitive to bumpy roads.
- Vehicles are open 4x4 vehicles accommodating 10 to 14 passengers. Please remain seated while the vehicle is moving.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- If you wish to swim at the waterfall, wear a swimsuit under your clothes, bring a towel from the ship, and water shoes. The waterfall water may not always be crystal clear, especially after rain, as the river carries topsoil and silt.
- The hike to the waterfall is approximately 15 minutes each way, over uneven trails with rough, sometimes slippery rocks. Be prepared to get your feet and shoes wet while crossing the stream.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière



Sightseeing

Drive through the historic town of Soufrière, passing the town square and Cathedral, and arrive at Sulphur Springs Park—home to the Caribbean's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly into the remnants of a volcanic crater, a dramatic moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and clouds of steam rise with the distinctive scent of sulphur.

Continue your journey to the Soufrière Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, this is one of the island's oldest estates. Stroll through the lush botanical garden, admire tropical plants lining the path, and enjoy the beauty of the cascading waterfall before reboarding the bus.

After a short drive, arrive at a charming hillside restaurant offering panoramic views of the iconic Pitons—St. Lucia's famous twin peaks rising dramatically from Soufrière Bay.

Have your camera ready for a perfect photo opportunity while enjoying a complimentary glass of local rum punch or fruit juice on the verandah. The tour concludes with a short drive back down to the port.

Please note:

- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, and US \$ if they wish to purchase souvenirs.



SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) – Zip line ride at Morne Coubaril Estate

This excursion combines a short sightseeing experience with the adrenaline rush of zip lining beneath the towering Petit Piton, offering breathtaking views of the historic town of Soufrière and the Caribbean Sea.

Depart from the port and enjoy a brief drive through the rustic town of Soufrière to Morne Coubaril Estate, a working plantation nestled in lush tropical surroundings. Begin with a guided walking tour of the estate's manicured gardens and traditional facilities. Visit the manioc house to learn how cassava bread is made, see how coconuts are de-husked and copra is dried, and enjoy fresh coconut water and jelly. At the cocoa and coffee house, taste a ripe cocoa bean and discover the fermentation, drying, and polishing process—complete with a demonstration of the traditional cocoa dance. Watch the mule-driven sugar cane mill in action and sip some freshly pressed cane juice.

After your tour, get equipped with a harness, helmet, and gloves, and receive a safety briefing before beginning your zip line adventure. Eight cables carry you effortlessly through the rainforest canopy and across a bamboo-shaded gorge. You'll zip past banyan, coconut, plum, and mango trees while enjoying stunning views of the bay and the Pitons. Your adventure concludes with a refreshment stop at a nearby restaurant and the opportunity to browse the estate's gift shop before returning to the ship.

Please note:

- This tour is only suitable for guests in very good physical condition. It is not recommended for guests with a fear of heights, pregnant women, or those with heart or respiratory conditions. Participants must sign a waiver.
- Minimum age: 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Maximum weight: 220 lbs / 113 kg.
- Wear comfortable clothing (jeans or bermuda-length shorts recommended), sneakers or closed-toe sandals (no flip-flops), shirts with short sleeves (no sleeveless tops) and bring hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, a change of shirt and US\$ or credit card for gift shop purchases. Long hair should be tied back in a ponytail or bun
- Safety gear (helmet, hairnet, gloves) is provided.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Soufrière and Tet Paul nature trail hike

Set off from the Soufrière dock for a short drive through town before heading "back to nature" on a guided hike along the Tet Paul Nature Trail, led by a knowledgeable local nature guide. As you walk through this spectacular landscape, your guide will share insights into the island's flora and fauna, folk remedies, local customs, and traditions, making this more than just a nature walk—it's an interactive cultural experience.

There will be plenty of breathtaking photo opportunities, including panoramic views of the majestic Pitons, the faraway island of St. Vincent, the lush southern region of St. Lucia, and Jalousie Bay. Be sure to bring your camera to capture the unforgettable scenery.

At the end of the trail, you'll have time to relax and enjoy local refreshments and snacks before returning to Soufrière.

- This tour is considered strenuous and is suitable only for guests in very good physical condition.
- The nature trail involves hiking through rainforest on uneven terrain, dirt tracks, narrow paths, and moderate to steep inclines. The trail may be muddy if it has rained recently. The hike takes approximately 45 minutes, depending on the group's pace. There is limited shade along the trail.
- Wear light, comfortable clothing and appropriate hiking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water. A refreshment will be served after the hike.
- The drive between Soufrière and the trailhead takes approximately 15 minutes on a winding, bumpy road.

 - o at 12:45 pm: for flights after 15:30 / 3:30pm (arrival at the airport at 13:15 / 1:15 pm).
 - o at 14:15 / 2:15 pm for flights after 17:00 / 5:00pm (arrival at the airport at 14:45 / 2:45 pm).
 - o at 16:30 / 4:30 pm for flights after 19:00 / 7:30 pm (arrival at the airport at 17:00 / 5:00 pm).

Included in the Package: transfers (port -> beach -> airport); luggage storage with assistance from a luggage attendant; one welcome drink; one beach chair per person and one shared umbrella; access to shower facilities and washrooms; two towels per guest (one for the beach, one for post-shower use).

The ship will be alongside at Barbados Cruise terminal (at 2 km from Bridgetown city center). BGI airport is located 18 km from the Cruise Terminal (approx. 45 minutes drive).

All guests are requested to leave the ship by 10:00am. There is no left-luggage service at the cruise terminal.



EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy**: excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate**: a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
